**The Populist Backlash to Liberal Internationalism, Public Lecture and Discussion, Professor Eric Posner,  
Freie Universität Berlin, Henry-Ford-Building, Garystraße 35, Hörsaal B, 20. Juni 2017, 18:30h**

A populist backlash around the world has targeted international law and legal institutions. Populists see international law as a device used by global elites to dominate policymaking and benefit themselves at the expense of the common people. This turn of events exposes the hollowness at the core of mainstream international law scholarship, for which the expansion of international law and the erosion of sovereignty have always been a forgone conclusion. But international law is dependent on public trust in technocratic rule-by-elites, which has been called into question by a series of international crises.

*Professor Posner is Kirkland and Ellis Distinguished Service Professor of Law, University of Chicago. His books include The Twilight of Human Rights Law (Oxford, 2014); Economic Foundations of International Law (with Alan Sykes) (Harvard, 2013); Contract Law and Theory (Aspen, 2011); The Executive Unbound: After the Madisonian Republic (with Adrian Vermeule) (Oxford, 2011); Climate Change Justice (with David Weisbach) (Princeton, 2010); He is a fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and a member of the American Law Institute.*

### **Position as Research Assistant (20h+/w), Lauterpacht Centre for International Law (Deadline: 20 June 2017)**

The Lauterpacht Centre for International Law wishes to appoint a research assistant to work on the initial review of the personal papers of influential international lawyers connected to the University of Cambridge. This is a fascinating opportunity to work on the history of international law in the UK in the 20th century.

An undergraduate or graduate degree in law is needed. A strong background in international law, discretion and good judgement are essential. Prior experience in archival research and an ongoing or completed PhD in international law are advantageous.

Over the summer of 2017, the successful applicant will work with an archivist on reviewing and cataloguing the personal papers and correspondence of several influential international lawyers. A steering group composed of several Lauterpacht Centre Fellows will oversee the project.

The successful applicant is expected to work at least 20 hours for 4-6 weeks over the summer of 2017. The desired start date is 3 July 2017, but there is some flexibility. The successful candidate will be paid as a Research Assistants at Grade 5 (£13.26 per hour) and be employed by the Temporary Employment Service (TES) at the University of Cambridge. Payment will be arranged upon the submission of electronic timesheets to TES.

Current Cambridge students must ensure that their work on the project does not contravene University policy about permissible working hours. The Temporary Employment Service will verify the successful candidate's eligibility to work in the UK.

Applications, including a one-page letter of motivation, CV, transcripts and the name of a referee should be submitted by email to Mrs Anita Rutherford, Lauterpacht Centre Administrator (admin at lcil.cam.ac.uk) no later than 20 June 2017.

### **Position as Early Stage Researcher (100%), Chair for European and International Economic Law, Prof. Christoph Herrmann (Deadline: 25 June 2017)**

The University of Passau invites applications for a full-time position as Early Stage Researcher (ESR) to start 1 September 2017 (or the earliest possible date thereafter). The contract will have a duration of three years. The gross salary will be approximately 3,060 euros per month, and provide for health and unemployment insurance (employees' social security contributions and taxes are deducted from the gross salary).



The position is part of an interdisciplinary EU-funded Horizon 2020 Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions Innovative Training Network (ITN) on transatlantic trade and investment. The ESR will work within the University of Passau's Law Faculty and enrol for a 3-year doctoral programme under the supervision of Professor Christoph Herrmann. The research project has the provisional title 'Tackling Technical Barriers to Trade in TTIP - An Example of Open, Competing or Conflicting Regionalism?' (details to be agreed between ESR and supervisor).

The objective of the ITN is to foster interdisciplinary research in transatlantic trade and investment. The network will have 15 ESRs at 11 different partners across Europe. The ESR will benefit from a wide-ranging training programme consisting of Advanced Training Courses and topical conferences organised by ITN partners across Europe. The ESR will contribute to ambitious and carefully planned research, outreach, impact and dissemination activities benefiting from the expertise of world-leading senior academics. Planned secondments (to be confirmed) include law firms, industry associations and research institutions.

We are seeking highly motivated and mobile candidates with a strong academic record holding at least a Master's degree in Law, fluency in English and other linguistic skills (some German proficiency would be an asset) and some subject knowledge of World Trade Law or EU External Trade Law.

Applicants of any nationality are welcome; the ESR will receive support on the condition that at times he or she moves from one country to another to broaden or deepen his or her competences. The successful candidate will, at the time of recruitment by the host organisation, be in the first four years (full-time equivalent research experience) of his or her research career and will have not yet been awarded a doctoral degree. Candidates with pending Master's degrees will be considered. When recruited the ESR shall not have resided or carried out his or her main activity (work, studies etc.) in Germany for more than 12 months in the 3 years immediately prior to the reference date. Short stays such as holidays are not taken into account.
