4. Agenda 2030: What Role for Human Rights? A Dialogue on the Role of Academic Institutions in Strengthening the Human Rights Perspective in the New Global Development Agenda

Background

In September 2015, leaders from 193 countries gathered in New York under the auspices of the UN to adopt a transformative development agenda. The so called Agenda 2030 is articulated along 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) covering the period 2016- 2030.

Envisioning structural transformation and social reform, the Agenda 2030 places democracy, good governance and the rule of law at the centre of its roadmap. The emphasis on democracy and social justice brings the promotion and protection of human rights to the fore, calling on efforts to strengthen institutional capacities in areas of governance and human rights as a key priority for post 2015 global development. But how exactly does the SDG Agenda incorporate the Human Rights framework? Which Role do Human Rights play – particularly in relation to the universal nature of the new goals?

Amongst the many contributors to the shaping up of a new post 2015 development narrative, a key role lies with Academia – educating students as future decision makers in setting the course

for a new sustainable development path, acting as a new conduit among different actors, and a leader in promoting the effective mainstreaming of issues such as governance and human rights across different disciplines. However, Universities and their teaching methods are still very much linked to sectoral approaches while particularly the 2030 Agenda demands interdisciplinary cooperation in both research and teaching for finding comprehensive political answers to current and future global challenges.

The key question is how academia can best contribute to mainstreaming a human rights approach in new global development thinking and which changes would universities need to undergo in order to better enhance interdisciplinary and human rights based teaching across disciplines.

It is in this context that the Heinrich-Böll-Foundation and Misereor are inviting to a policy-research dialogue among representatives from government, academia, NGOs and the private sector to discuss the role of research and academic institutions in Agenda 2030 with particular emphasis on human rights mainstreamed within it.

The meeting will bring together national and international experts looking at best avenues to effectively introduce human rights thinking in the education of future decision makers. It will aim at getting experts' insights on the current status, challenges and opportunities of mainstreaming human rights in higher education.

12. Frankfurt Investment Law Workshop 2016 – ICSID at 50: Investment Arbitration as a Motor of General International Law?

Goethe University Frankfurt am Main, 11/12 March 2016 (Deadline for registration: 28 February 2016)

For many decades, international investment law and investor-State arbitration have been seen as highly specialized, even exotic, legal disciplines. Meanwhile international investment law is slowly, but steadily, moving mainstream with increasing numbers of investment treaties, proliferating investment disputes, the negotiations of mega-regionals, such as the Transatlantic Trade and Investment Partnership of the Trans-Pacific Partnership, and the ensuing public debates. These developments not only lead to increasing attention to investment law among general international lawyers. They are likely also to be reflected in an increasing contribution of investment law and investor-State arbitration to the development of international law. At the occasion of the 50th anniversary of the entry into force of the ICSID Convention, the 2016 Frankfurt Investment Law Workshop inquires whether, and to what extent, international investment law and investor-State arbitration are ‘engines of legal development’ and have radiating effect in general international law. Topics addressed are the contribution of investment law and investor-State arbitration to the international law of dispute settlement, the law of treaties, and state responsibility.

- How does the use of a particular theoretical perspective influence the process and the outcomes of the making of international law?

On the panel:

Structural deficits of the United Nations and its key bodies have been addressed on multiple occasions since the Organization's creation in 1945. Since then, the UN has been the target of various reform proposals – by its own organs, UN regional groups, blocs of member states as well as other (non-related) both intergovernmental and supranational institutions. A substantial share of the international community of states is certain about the necessity for reforming the UN system and its key organs. A lack of transparency, of representativeness and of efficiency in decision-making are among the critique made the most often – next to an excessive bureaucracy, the incapacity to act according to the Organization's own Charter and a strong political dependency on the main budgetary contributors. The exclusive veto powers allocated to the UN Security Council's five permanent members (the P5), the veto's repeated misuse and individual actors' interests and preferences have been preventing any comprehensive reform of the Organization as much as of its key bodies, till date.

These panels shall address the questions, critique, arguments and solutions made in the contemporary debate on the United Nations reform. Located at the intersection of international relations, international institutions and security studies, the panel is designed to feature research from graduate students on all related issues.

Special regard is paid – but not exclusively, to:

- the organisational structure, funding, decision-making processes and governance of the UN
- the UN membership, UN regional groups and informal formations within or related to the UN
- the UN's main organs including the UN Security Council (UNSC), the UN General Assembly (UNGA), the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC), the UN Secretariat, the UN Trusteeship Council and the International Court of Justice (ICJ)

7. “Best practices for the protection of water in times of crisis. Focus on participatory instruments in environmental law and policies”

Workshop and Expert Seminar, Friedrich-Alexander-Universität Erlangen-Nürnberg, 22 and 23 April 2016 (Deadline: 22 January 2016)

The Friedrich-Alexander-Universität Erlangen-Nürnberg and the Università degli Studi di Torino are organising a two-day interdisciplinary and comparative seminar for PhD students, Post-Docs, junior researchers and practitioners/experts in environmental law, economics and policies with a focus on the protection of water in times of crisis.

We welcome any submissions for short interventions/posters and comparative discussion thereof from the viewpoint of the national legal orders, the EU legal order or international law, which show how the use of participatory instruments (e.g. under the regime of the Aarhus Convention and Directive 2000/35, but also the Water Framework Directive or of national law) can contribute to the protection of water resources (ground water, drinking water, rivers, sea water) against pollution, loss through economic/transport activities, or to a guarantee of access to (clean) water as a common good.

Possible contributions could include:

- Water as a common good and its protection by public participation.
- The use of Bürgerinitiativen, plebiscites, referenda and other means of public participation for the above mentioned objectives.
- General questions of public participation in environmental law and democracy.
- The relationship of national, international and supranational law in the protection of water resources, especially in cross-border contexts (i.e. regimes for rivers to be used by two neighbouring states).
- Access to water as a human right and its realisation in the national legal orders.
- Economic approaches to a better management of water resources.
- Theoretical (economic, political, social, philosophical) concepts underlying the protection of water resources by law, by public participation or by other social participation.
- Examples of best practices in implementing the participatory approach.

Objective of the Seminar and contributions:

The objective is to offer a comparative overview of the participatory rights for citizens and, as their counterpart, the duties for the authorities in Germany and in Italy as Member States of the European Union as regards the protection of water. To explore the best practices related to participatory rights, we will use a case study method, comparing legislation, administrative proceedings and case law as well as their functioning in practice and underlying theoretical concepts.

Short interventions (max. 15 minutes) will be discussed in small panels by using a comparative grid, thus working together on a comparative study. This reflects a new methodological ap-

proach in comparative law based on comparison through the lens of International and EU law. Practitioners and experts will discuss together with academics with the aim to find common solutions to the research questions. The results will be published in a printed collection of papers.

Several key-note speeches will round up the venture.

We welcome abstracts for manuscripts in the mentioned areas of research (no more than 500 words). Manuscripts should be well developed, but at a stage where they can still benefit from the group's discussion.

The first two Annual Meetings of ICON-S (Florence 2014 and New York 2015) have been overwhelming successes. The time has come to turn our attention to the 2016 Annual Meeting. 14. “Law between Global and Colonial: Techniques of Empire”

Conference, University of Helsinki, 3-5 October 2016, (Deadline: 1 March 2016)

The Conference Law Between Global and Colonial: Techniques of Empire proposes to discuss the legal languages and techniques through which colonial powers ruled non-European territories and populations throughout the modern age. The aim of the Conference is to examine in detail the juridical practices and discourses of colonial powers when they exercised their supremacy over colonial subjects and disciplined them. Given the complexity and variety of these legal strategies and without neglecting the classical the study of “law of nature and nations”, we intend to move beyond it in order to explore a hybrid normative body consisting of ad-hoc colonial laws, commercial laws and domestic laws adapted to colonial contexts. What came to be called the “empire of free trade”, for instance, operated largely through a commercial law (sometimes, though not always called “lex mercatoria”) that possessed features of both international and domestic law.

Although the focus of the conference is historical, the interest feeding it lies in the present. With the great numbers of people moving about in Europe, Asia and Africa as migrants, guest workers, refugees and displaced persons, territorial states have often used methods and techniques that resemble those with which colonial populations once were treated. With research showing a sharp rise in world inequality, the conference poses the question whether legislative techniques and institutions inherited from the imperial past, once again see the light of day in the present.

How was the “law of nations” understood when it was used for imperial purposes? Would domestic laws apply to colonial expansion? What laws might govern the groups concerned – indigenous population, settlers, slaves, indentured servants, subjects of third nations? What was the role of the idiom of international law in Europe’s colonial expansion? To what extent was

colonial rule organised by domestic laws of a special character? How did special colonial laws and the “law of nature and nations” relate to each

other? To what extent did any of these laws open an avenue to contesting colonial governance? How far did such techniques extend beyond the end of the period of formal colonialism and even decolonization?

To answer such questions, the relations between global and domestic laws in imperial expansion and colonial governance ought to be studied.

The conference will close the four and a half-year period of the Finnish Academy research project on “International Law, Religion and Empire” at the Erik Castrén Institute of International Law and Human Rights, University of Helsinki.
